June 2013 Hawai'i Public High School Graduates Enrolled in English and Mathematics Classes at the University of Hawai'i in Fall 2013

The focus of this analysis is the unduplicated headcount of Hawai'i public high school graduates enrolled in remedial, developmental or "college level" English and mathematics courses at any of the ten campuses within the University of Hawai'i (UH) System. Some students take more than one English class and more than one mathematics class, particularly at the remedial level. Hence, the headcount method counts each student only once and at the lowest level enrolled course. This method is also a "snapshot" or point-in-time analysis for the Fall 2013 semester, and looks at recent Hawai'i State Department of Education (DOE) high school graduates who enrolled at a UH campus the immediate fall semester following high school graduation (Class of 2013 graduates).

The UH faculty makes a distinction between remedial and developmental coursework. Remedial coursework covers the basic foundational knowledge that underlies literacy and numeracy skills. Developmental coursework prepares students for college-level or credit bearing courses, generally towards their degree or certificate requirements. Across the UH System, "college level" courses are generally numbered 100 or above. Courses that do not fit the remedial or developmental definition and in some instances are numbered less than 100 may be used satisfy general education, degree, or certificate requirements. For the purposes of this report, these courses are categorized as "Other".

English and mathematics are also considered "gateway" courses at the University of Hawai'i, and are required by almost every degree and/or certificate the University offers. Gateway courses introduce students to the discipline of college, and at times, of a major. Many studies advocate the importance of students completing their gateway courses early in their college years. These studies suggest that students who enroll and complete their gateway courses immediately upon entering college are more likely to graduate and successfully earn their college degree than those who defer taking these courses.

Of the 11,261 June 2013 Hawai'i public high school graduates, 4,258 enrolled at the University of Hawai'i in Fall 2013¹:

This year we added a new category called "College Credit Earned While in High School". This category accounts for students who have earned college credit prior to fall as a first-time freshman. Credits may have been earned from UH via dual credit, exams such as Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate, or earned in the summer after high school graduation.

Note: Students who earned college credit prior to Fall 2013 may or may not be enrolled in a English or Math course in Fall 2013.

ENGLISH COURSES

- College Credit Earned While in High School was added this year and numbers for previous years are not available.
- For Fall 2013, 188 or 4.4% earned college credit for English while in high school.
- For Fall 2013, 1,728 or 40.6% enrolled in college level (course numbers ≥ 100) English courses. This is a decrease of 1 percentage point over the enrollment of high school graduates in Fall 2012.
- The percentage of students enrolling into remedial or developmental English classes for Fall 2013, remained the same as Fall 2012 at 30.8%.
- The percentage of students who enrolled in remedial English increased from Fall 2012 while the percentage enrolling in developmental English decreased.
 - Remedial English
 - Fall 2012: 280 (or 8.4%) of 3,334 students enrolled in English
 - Fall 2013: 365 (or 11.4%) of 3,193 students enrolled in English
 - Developmental English
 - Fall 2012: 1,077 (or 32.3%) of 3,334 students enrolled in English
 - Fall 2013: 946 (or 29.6%) of 3,193 students enrolled in English
- For Fall 2013, 877 or 20.6% did not enroll in English, showing decrease over Fall 2012 by 3.7 percentage points. It is unknown into which category these students would have placed; remedial, developmental, or college level.

MATHEMATICS COURSES

- College Credit Earned While in High School was added this year and numbers for previous years are not available.
- For Fall 2013, 53 or 1.2% earned college credit for math while in high school.
- For Fall 2013, 1,138 or 26.7% of high school graduates enrolled into college level mathematics courses, which shows an increase of 2.9 percentage points over Fall 2012.

- Of the 2,689 students enrolled in math, the overall percentage of students that enrolled in remedial or developmental courses showed a decrease over Fall 2012 by a total of 6.4 percentage points.
 - Remedial Mathematics
 - Fall 2012: 591 (or 20.9%) of 2,831 students enrolled in math
 - Fall 2013: 553 (or 20.6%) of 2,689 students enrolled in math
 - Developmental Mathematics
 - Fall 2012: 1,002 (or 35.4%) of 2,831 students enrolled in math
 - Fall 2013: 789 (or 29.3%) of 2,689 students enrolled in math
- For Fall 2013, 1,516 or 35.6% did not enroll in mathematics, a slight decrease in enrollment over Fall 2012. It is unknown which category these students would have placed; remedial, developmental, or college level.

Tables 2 and 5 show headcounts and percentages sorted alphabetically by Hawai'i public high schools. These are horizontal percentages, which is calculated by dividing the high school's category headcount (i.e. remedial, development, enrolled, not enrolled) by the high school's total headcount of graduates.

Tables 3 and 6 show headcounts and percentages of student course taking by the students' "home" campus within the University of Hawai'i system. These are also horizontal percentages, which are calculated by dividing the campus's category headcount (i.e. remedial, developmental, enrolled, and not enrolled) by the campus's total enrollment headcount.
